With 12 Towns represented the Clerk declared a quorum.

The Minutes were presented. A motion to approve was made by Sue Moran and seconded by Alan McClellan. Passed Unanimously.

Treasurer Don Picard presented the finance report indicating a balance of \$3,867.00. Motion to approve Alan McClellan, second Sims McGrath, passed unanimously.

Paul Hebert suggested that we have name tags to facilitate conversation and getting to know each other.

President Post Introduced Rep. Hunt who reported on issues moving in the legislature. Both houses had passed criminal justice reform and it was in conference committee. On the health care financing front, the State's inflation target was met in the hospital/medical area, 3.2% but not in the drug area, well over 4%. It is anticipated that the GIC will lower rates in the coming year. Rep. Hunt is also working alternates to Comcast for Cape Cod.

Senator Cyr commented on the Senate's action on climate change and resiliency. He explained the current status of zoning reform. Sen. Cyr then talked on the issue of wastewater and the occupancy legislation explaining that the senate had taken up adding a 2.75% surcharge to fund a wastewater infrastructure fund.

Senator DeMacedo spoke on the State's financial condition noting that revenues have turned up since the beginning of the year. He also commented on the H2B visa shortage and the impact that was having cape wide. The Senator closed with comments on the status of Plymouth nuke plant.
